

London Legacy Impact Report

On 1 & 2 April, Common Purpose delivered the London Legacy Programme

Legacy is a global campaign by Common Purpose which invests in young people across the world so they can become a connected generation of leaders with a clear vision for what their legacy will be.

We ran our second London Legacy on 1 and 2 April 2025 at Wavemaker UK. 80 young people applied to do the programme and 53 completed it. They had a challenging and full agenda where they met with civic and business leaders from across London.

This diverse group of 53 young leaders aged 18-25 came from different communities, backgrounds and beliefs. Some in employment, some not; some studying, some volunteering; many are activists, others finding their own causes. The one thing they have in common is their generation.

Without London Legacy these young leaders may otherwise have never met - let alone worked together to cross boundaries in London.

We don't believe young people should be held back in their careers just because they don't "know someone"

Their observations

Rates aren't decreasing. People typically get involved in this due to contextual issues e.g socioeconomic status, lack of role models Young adults have less access for Mental health resources, they had in schools and with family but in London they struggling to find right place and to cope with mental health crisis We don't believe that there is a level playing field between those who have industry connections and those who don't.

We think there is an opportunity to bridge the gap by addressing those not equipped with the necessary skills or exposure to opportunities others have.

The changes they would like to see

Youth clubs, role models & mentoring - and backing from big corps.

Improved 3rd spaces provisions that are backed by big orgs.

Through the use of social media it can help young people in London create new support groups and have access to knowledge and resources that they may have not know was readily available to them.

An organisation that provides services to schools in two areas.

- 1. Equipping you with skills: leading workshops with those in the industry- offering mentors to those who require a connections.
- 2. Exposing you to opportunities: Access to range of industries & apprenticeships via a centralised platform / website.



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This week. I had the opportunity to attend the #LondonLegacy 2-day leadership programme by Common Purpose. The sessions explored what makes a great leader, the skills and traits that define leadership, the causes that drive us. and the role of leadership in a complex city like London.

On Day 1, we heard from Ayesha Hameed who shared her journey in leadership and shed light on the deeper challenges faced by some of London's most disadvantaged communities.

Later, we visited Grant Thornton UK, a top 7 accountancy firm, where we met Paul Dossett. Partner in Public Sector Audit. His insights on leadership were truly inspiring. A few key takeaways from our discussion:

- Leadership is about collaboration, not just delegation.
- read leaders understand what their team needs, not just what they need from their team.
- You won't always get the team you want, but strong leadership means making the best of the team you have.

We also had the chance to hear from incredible graduates working towards their ACA qualification. Their hard work, determination, and career journeys were truly motivating.

A huge thank you to our facilitators, Anna Colao & Ruhana Ali, for making this experience so impactful! Though I couldn't attend Day 2 due to unforeseen circumstances, Day 1 alone left me inspired to continue driving change, innovating, and growing as both a leader and an individual.
